Header

- **Incident Name (Block 1):** Name of the Incident/activation event. This information will be provided by the Net Manager, Radio Officer, or his designee.
- **Operational Period (Block 2):** Start date (month/day/year) and time (24-hour local time) and end date and time for the activation event.
- **Name (Block 3):** Name of the facility being supported by ACS. For example, if ACS/ARES® is supporting an emergency evacuation shelter, the name of the shelter should be entered into this field.
- **ICS Position (Block 4):** The individual in charge of the ACS unit (e.g., site lead) and the job being performed by ACS. In almost all cases, the job being performed is *Radio Operator*.
- **Home Agency (and Unit) (Block 5):** Name of the organization completing the form. Users should enter *Pinellas ACS*.
- **Resources Assigned (Block 6):** This field contains the Name and FCC call sign of everyone assigned to the ACS unit located at the facility identified in Block 3.

Significant Events



- When the form is used to record the events associated with a single individual, enter all departures and arrivals. Users should include odometer readings for personally owned vehicles.
 - Home, Deployment locations, Intermediate sites (e.g., EOC to pick up shelter radio kit, gas stations, etc.)
- Arrival and departure of ACS/ARES® personnel
- Shift and operator changes
- Changes to station operational availability. Include addition or loss of specific bands, modes, power, etc.
- Changes in utility status (e.g., shore power, internet, cell service, water, etc.)
- Events that could impact the ability of the deployed location to perform its defined mission (e.g., Generator failures, supply shortages, structural damage, overcrowding, unrest, etc.)
- Meetings and Briefings
- Issues with personnel
- Injuries
- Rumors
- Task assignments and completions

- **Radio Net Name / Tactical Call Sign / Location (Block 3):** The content of this field is dependent on the position being filled by the Radio Operator.
 - NCS/ANCS: Name of the radio net being managed by the NCS and ANCS.
 - Net Participant: Tactical call sign of the net participant. If no tactical call sign has been assigned, this field will contain the location of the participant.
- **Radio Operator (Block 4):** Name and FCC call sign of the primary radio operator / Site Lead.

- **Time:** The time each message was sent/received. Use 24-hour format (Local Time).
- **Call Sign/ID FROM:** The FCC call sign or Tactical Call Sign of the station sending the message. When the sending station is the local station (i.e., the station identified in Blocks 3 and 4), the field can be left blank.
- **Call Sign/ID TO:** The FCC call sign or tactical call sign of the station directly receiving the message. When the receiving station is the local station, the field can be left blank.
- **Msg # / Precedence / Origin:**
 - Formal message – The message number, message precedence, and the FCC call sign of the station that originated the message.
 - Informal message – This field will contain the message precedence.
- **Message Subject/Notes:** The subject of the message and any additional information that will help identify or track the message.

- 1624 – Equipment set-up complete
- 1712 – First Evacuees arrive
- 1726 – Evacuee complaining that food is not warm enough. Making a scene.
- 1741 – Shelter manager reports shortage of Cots – Creates ICS 213 message

Pinellas EOC

- 1437 – ACS Team Arrives on Site
- 1441 – Team notifies NCS, WA4XYZ, that EOC site is operational and will assume Net Control
- 1507 – ACS transitions from Activation level 2 to activation level 1
- 1515 – Notified that Bauder Elementary shelter is being opened
- 1522 – Bauder team notified and asked to deploy
- 1610 – Notified by phone that additional ACS EOC team member is running 15 minutes late

- 1825 – Additional Cots and blankets arrive
- 1829 – Notified EOC that Cots and Blankets have arrived
- 1911 – Cell and internet service failure
- 1939 – New evacuee reports building collapse and fires on the beach. Information spreading rapidly amongst evacuees
- 1941 – Notified EOC of building collapse rumor
- 2005 – Shelter manager reports shelter status via ICS 213

Pinellas EOC

- 1832 – Notified that Boca Ciega High shelter is being opened immediately
- 1838 – Boca Ciega team notified and asked to deploy
- 1947 – EOC notifies Bauder that reported rumor is bogus
- 1955 – WA4ACS Winlink RMS now operational
